Dear Judy,

This letter will confirm our telephone conversation yesterday.

I was informed yesterday afternoon that you are in possession of biological material addressed to Dr. Lombardi. Dr. Lombardi asked you to deliver the cell lines to him and you refused. When you confirmed to me that you had possession of this material, I directed that you return it to Dr. Lombardi immediately. You refused to honor my express directive, were insubordinate and insolent.

Your actions have shown a complete lack of respect for your colleague and for my authority as the President and CEO of this institute. Therefore, I am confirming in writing that you have been terminated as an employee. All access to the research laboratory will be restricted until my return next week.

I want to end this letter in a positive manner and thank you for all of your contributions to WPI. You are a very talented, dedicated and passionate person who has shown a sincere commitment to those who suffer from ME. Our dedication to serving patients around the world through WPI's critical research program, medical practice and patient outreach was truly enhanced by your help. We will continue all of our efforts until we have answers for these patients.
